COMMUNITY PLANNING

- Completed citywide Comprehensive Plans for Fairfield, Helena, and Morris and initiated new plans for Fultondale and Moody.
- Developed a new Shelby County Comprehensive Plan (the first since 2004).
- Won an outstanding planning award from the AL Chapter of the APA for the Downtown Calera Rezoning Project.
- Provided mapping and technical assistance to 14 projects throughout the region.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Received a \$500,000 EPA
 Brownfields Assessment grant to initiate Regional Brownfields Assessment Program.
- Awarded a \$250,000 USDA Rural
 Placemaking Innovation Challenge
 to conduct Economic Strategic Plans for
 three communities in Walker County.
- Published the 5-Year Update for the regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).
- Issued 83 loans totalling over \$3.5
 million through partnership with
 Sabre Finance.

MEDICAID WAIVER

- Secured \$20,000 in grant funds through the Lucille Beeson Foundation to provide emergency assistance to members. These funds have been used to fulfill more than 100 emergent requests for our most at risk aging population.
- Served 1,067 elderly or disabled individuals throughout the metropolitan area, saving the state approximately \$75 million in funding.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNING

- Initiated a Safety Program to analyze crash data for all six RPCGB counties.
- Completed or initiated 7 roadway (APPLE) studies, including:
 - Chalkville Road/Chalkville Mountain Road Corridor Study, Trussville
 - Helena Old Town Pedestrian Improvements Study, Helena
 - New Trails and Sidewalks Study,
 Alabaster
 - US-280 Traffic Operations Study, Chelsea

 - US-411 Intersections Study, Moody
 - US-31 Pedestrian Improvement,
 Access Management and Operations
 Study, Homewood

AGENCY INITIATIVES

CommuteSmart

- Added 572 new participants in the program and maintained an average of 25 vanpools per month.
- Reduced more than 9.1 million commuter miles and saved participants over \$5 million in commuter costs.
- Gained two new corporate partners and attended 17 outreach events to promote the program.

Alabama Partners for Clean Air (APCA)

- Reduced traffic emissions by over 119 pounds per day through partnership initiatives.
- Increased alternative fuel usage in the metropolitan area by 2,951,540 gallons.
- Gained pledges from 6,037 residents agreeing to promote air quality and reduce emissions.
